This list compiles publications stemming from the International Health Policy Survey. It represents a non-exhaustive collection based on an ad hoc search methodology. The starting point for the search was the German 2021 [evaluation of participation in the International Health Policy Survey](#) (see Appendix A1 of the document). Only publications with assigned DOI numbers were included, resulting in a focus on peer-reviewed journal articles. Grey literature, including most publications by the Commonwealth Fund (CWF) on the CWF's homepage, was excluded from this compilation.

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
